3 A RESOLUTION supporting an amendment to the United States Constitution to regulate corporate political spending and campaign financing. 4 5 WHEREAS, in a 2010 decision by the U.S. Supreme Court, *Citizens* 6 United v. the Federal Election Commission, the Supreme Court overturned some 7 provisions of the federal Campaigning Reform Act enacted in 2002, and ruled that 8 corporate entities have the same rights as persons to unrestricted spending on 9 political speech, and 10 11 WHEREAS, in reaching its decision, a majority of the Supreme Court 12 interpreted the First Amendment of the Constitution to afford corporations the 13 same free speech protections as natural persons, and 14 WHEREAS the Court's decision in effect allows unlimited corporate 15 spending to influence federal campaigns, elections, lawmaking, and public policy 16 17 decisions, and 18 WHEREAS, in the two years since the ruling, there has been tremendous 19 growth in contributions and spending by super political action committees for 20 media advertisements and related independent electioneering activities, and 21 WHEREAS the Court's decision in the matter of Citizens United v. the 22 23 Federal Election Commission severely restricts the ability of federal, state, and 24 local governments to enact reasonable campaign finance reforms and regulations

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regarding corporate political activity, and

In a 2010 decision by the U.S. Supreme Court, Citizens United v. the Federal Election Commission, the Supreme Court overturned some provisions of the federal Campaigning Reform Act enacted in 2002, and ruled that corporate entities have the same rights as persons to unrestricted spending on political speech. The Court's decision in effect allows unlimited corporate spending to influence federal campaigns, elections, lawmaking, and public policy decisions. Several proposed amendments to the Constitution have recently been introduced in Congress that would allow governments to regulate the raising and spending of money by corporations to influence elections.

The City of Tacoma calls on the Washington State Legislature and the United States Congress to initiate steps to amend the United States Constitution with provisions that clearly state that:

Corporations are not human beings, and only human beings are endowed with Constitutional rights.

Contributions and expenditures for political purposes are not constitutionally-protected speech, and that, therefore, regulating political contributions and spending is not equivalent to limiting political speech.

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Congress and the states shall have the power to regulate contributions and expenditures for campaigns and ballot measures, and to require public disclosure of the sources of such contributions and expenditures.
