

## TOWN OF SHARON, NEW HAMPSHIRE

### TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Sharon, New Hampshire, in the County of Hillsborough, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet in the Sharon Meeting House in said Town on Tuesday, March 11, 2014 at 11:00 in the forenoon to ballot for Town Officers and other questions required by law to be decided by ballot. The polls will be closed at 7:00 P.M. The business meeting will start at 8:00 P.M. on the same date at the Sharon Meeting House.

**ARTICLE 1.** To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

**ARTICLE 2.** To see if the Town will vote to set the following amounts which shall be paid to the Town Officers for their services, or take any action relative thereto:

**ARTICLE 4.** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$7,920 to pay a per capita membership fee for residents using the Peterborough Town Library, Account 4550, or take any action relative thereto.

**ARTICLE 5.** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500 to be placed in the Brick School House Maintenance Fund, Account 4915.8 previously established, or take any action relative thereto. This article is designated as a special warrant article under the provisions of RSA 32:3,VI(c). The selectmen recommend this article.

**ARTICLE 6.** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000 to be placed in the Archive Supplies Fund, Account 4915.9 previously established, or take any action relative thereto. This article is designated as a special warrant article under the provisions of RSA 32:3,VI(c). The selectmen recommend this article.

**ARTICLE 7.** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$10,000 to be placed in the Legal Expense Fund, Account 4915.7 previously established, or take any action relative thereto. This article is designated as a special warrant article under the provisions of RSA 32:3,VI(c). The selectmen recommend this article.

**ARTICLE 8.** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000 to be placed in the Town Bridge Fund, Account 4915.2 previously established, or take any action relative thereto. This article is designated as a special warrant article under the provisions of RSA 32:3,VI(c). The selectmen recommend this article.

**ARTICLE 9.** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$15,000 to be placed in the Town Highway Repairs Fund, Account 4915.3 previously established, or take any action relative thereto. This article is designated as a special warrant article under the provisions of RSA 32:3,VI(c). The selectmen recommend this article.

**ARTICLE 10.**

By petition of 10 or more eligible voters of the town of Sharon to see if the town will urge:

That the New Hampshire State Legislature join nearly 500 municipalities and 16 other states, including all other New England states, in calling upon Congress to move forward a constitutional amendment that guarantees the right of our elected representatives and of the American people to safeguard fair elections through authority to regulate political spending, and clarifies that constitutional rights were established for people, not corporations.

That the New Hampshire Congressional delegation support such a constitutional amendment.

That the New Hampshire State Legislature support such an amendment once it is approved by Congress and sent to the State for ratification.

The record of the vote approving this article shall be transmitted by written notice to New Hampshire's congressional delegation, and to New Hampshire's state legislators, and to the President of the United States informing them of the instructions from their constituents by the selectmen within 30 days of the vote.

**ARTICLE 11.** To transact any other business which legally shall come before this meeting.
