- ARTICLE 20. Shall the voters of the Town of Calais vote to exempt from taxation for a period not to exceed five years properties owned by the Maple Corner Community Center, Inc., the Calais Recreation Association, Inc., and the Adamant Community Club?
- ARTICLE 21. Shall the voters of the Town of Calais vote to exempt from taxation for a period not to exceed five years property owned by the Nature Conservancy and commonly known as the Chickering Bog Nature Preserve?
- ARTICLE 22. Shall the voters designate the Town of Calais as a Property Assessed Clean Energy (PACE) District to enable participating property owners to access funding for eligible energy efficiency and renewable energy projects and then pay back the cost as a regular municipal assessment on that property owner's property tax or other municipal bill as provided for by 24 V.S.A. Chapter 87 (Section 3261 et seq.) and authorize the Selectboard to enter into an agreement with Vermont Energy Investment Corporation d/b/a Efficiency Vermont to operate the PACE program?
- ARTICLE 23. To see if the voters of Calais will adopt the following Calais Food Sovereignty Resolution: We the undersigned voters of the town of Calais, Vermont resolve to declare the right of our community to produce, process, sell, and purchase local foods. We believe that our citizens are able to make informed decisions about their food choices free of federal and state regulations that impede local food production and usurp a citizen's right to make free decisions about the food they wish to eat.
- ARTICLE 24. To see if the voters of Calais will adopt the following:
In light of the United States Supreme Court's *Citizens United* decision that equates money with speech and gives corporations

rights constitutionally intended for natural persons, shall the town of Calais vote on Tuesday, March 6, 2012 to urge the Vermont Congressional Delegation and the U.S. Congress to propose a U.S. Constitutional amendment for the Sates' consideration which provides that money is not speech, and that corporations are not persons under the U.S. Constitution, that the General Assembly of the State of Vermont pass a similar resolution, and that the town send its resolution to Vermont State and Federal representatives within thirty days of passage?

ARTICLE 25. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

ARTICLE 26. To adjourn the meeting.
