Town of Manitowish Waters Shall the Town of Manitowish Waters adopt the following resolutions?
Question 1: "Resolved that "We the People" of the Town of Manitowish Waters support proposed Wisconsin legislation that would create a new redistricting procedure that would be used after each federal census, putting the responsibility of redistricting in the hands of the non-partisan Legislative Reference Bureau (LRB). The bill, at its core, would require maps drawn by the LRB to satisfy the following criteria:
<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The plan must be based on population requirements and cannot take into consideration other things such as political party, race, color or language. 2. Districts must satisfy equal population standards set out in the Wisconsin Constitution. 3. District boundaries must coincide with municipal ward boundaries as much as possible, with wards divided among as few Assembly Districts as possible. 4. Districts must be composed of neighboring territory and be as compact as possible. 5. In preparing the plan, LRB must be strictly non-partisan, with no district drawn for the purpose of favoring a political party or legislator. 6. There must be between 54 and 100 Assembly District, each State Senate District must contain only whole Assembly District, and each Congressional District must contain only whole State Senate Districts."
