(RENEWAL)
LAKE COUNTY
(ADAMHS BOARD)**

A majority affirmative vote is necessary for passage.

A renewal of a tax for the benefit of Lake County for the purpose of supplementing general fund appropriations for the renovation, financing, maintenance, and operation of mental health facilities by the Lake County Alcohol, Drug Addiction, and Mental Health Services Board at a rate not exceeding 0.9 mill for each one dollar of valuation, which amounts to 9 cents for each one hundred dollars of valuation, for ten years, commencing in 2015, first due in calendar year 2016.
